

You may do so by placing your card in the offering plate on Sunday, or by mailing or emailing it to the church office. Extra copies of the estimate of giving card are still available at the back of the worship space or can be requested from the church office.



As we reminded ourselves this fall, we are church, we are called, and in response to all that God has first given us, we respond by using our God-given gifts and abilities for the

sake of the gospel and the world. Sharing generously of our financial gifts makes our congregation's many and varied ministries possible, and our estimates of giving for next year help our congregation better plan for our mission and ministry together. Thank you for all the ways in which you are so generous in response to all that God has already done for us!

A Special Opportunity for Those 70½ Years and Older

As the end of the year approaches, did you know that you can give any amount (up to a maximum of \$100,000) per year from your IRA directly to a qualified charity such as Emanuel Lutheran Church and/or other ELCA ministries without having to pay income taxes on the money? Gifts of any value \$100,000 or less are eligible for this benefit and can be a great way to support the mission and ministry of the church. This popular gift option is commonly called the IRA charitable rollover, but you may also see it referred to as a qualified charitable distribution, or QCD for short. QCDs can also be used for Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) from IRAs and retirement plan accounts for people who must withdraw annually starting with the year they reach age 72 (73 if they reached age 72 after Dec. 31, 2022).

Why consider such a gift?

- Your gift will be put to use today, allowing you to see the difference your gift is making.
- If you are required to take minimum distributions, you can use your gift to satisfy all or part of your RMD obligation.
- You pay no income taxes on the gift. The transfer generates neither taxable income nor a tax deduction, so you benefit even if you do not itemize your deductions.
- Since the gift doesn't count as income, it can reduce your annual income level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) will be holding the next Youth Gathering in July 2024! It has been since 2018 that the ELCA has been able to gather for this life changing event. Typically, the Gathering is held every three years. The Gathering's mission of faith formation in young people is the focus for this powerful and transformational ministry.

Emanuel Lutheran Church (ELC) adult youth leaders are preparing to accompany ELC youth who are now 8th graders through 12th graders.

The Gathering's motto, "Created to Be", from Psalm 139:14 speaks to all: "I will give thanks and praise to You, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made; Wonderful are Your works, and my soul knows it very well".

The Gathering welcomes those youth participating in the Multicultural Youth Leadership Event (MYLE), youth with disabilities (tAble), and all who are eligible by grade to participate in the Gathering. The goal of the Gathering is to create environments and opportunities for faith formation through worship, interactive learning, Bible study, service, and fellowship.
