## FIRST READING: PSALM 23

#### SECOND READING: ROMANS 8:22-35, 37-39

<sup>22</sup>We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now; <sup>23</sup>and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. <sup>24</sup>For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? <sup>25</sup>But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

<sup>26</sup>Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. <sup>27</sup>And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. <sup>28</sup>We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose.

If God is for us, who is against us? <sup>32</sup>He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? <sup>33</sup>Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. <sup>34</sup>Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. <sup>35</sup>Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? <sup>37</sup>No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. <sup>38</sup>For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, <sup>39</sup>nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.



# \*APOSTLES' CREED




# **\*COMMENDATION**



The Reverend Susan E. Nagle, a beacon of faith and compassion, passed away on December 10, 2024, at the age of 75. Born on June 22, 1949, in Torrington, Connecticut, Susan dedicated her life to serving others and spreading kindness.

Susan's family moved to Wilmington, Delaware in 1956 where she spent her formative years with her brother Michael "Mike" and sister Jan. Susan dedicated her career to serving congregations in New Jersey, New York and Connecticut, and supporting her congregation in Vermont after her retirement. Susan and husband Andy recently moved to West Hartford to be close to care and family. Throughout her life she pursued her passion for theology and service earning a Master of Divinity from Princeton Theological Seminary, an education that would become the foundation of her remarkable journey in ministry.

Ordained as a pastor in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, Rev. Nagle devoted 33 years to active ministry, touching lives and inspiring faith across six congregations. During her career her dedication extended beyond the pulpit as she served on the Boards of Philadelphia Seminary and Upsala College, as well as on the Executive Committee of the Lutheran World Federation and was Board Chair of the ELCA Board of Mission and Development. Her influence and guidance left an indelible mark on the institutions and individuals she served.

Susan's life was rich with the love of her family. She is survived by her devoted husband Andrew; her sister Jan Johnson; her beloved son Martin Nagle and his wife Tanya; and her cherished daughter Ellen Lyman and her husband Matt. Her legacy continues through her grandchildren Sara, Andrew, Audrey, and Ryan, who will carry forward her spirit of love and generosity.

Beyond her ministerial and familial roles, Susan had a profound appreciation for the arts. She was often found in the company of fellow music enthusiasts, attending classical music concerts. Her melodious voice was a staple in choral groups, where she shared her love of song and harmony with her community.

Rev. Susan E. Nagle's life was one of unwavering faith, love, and service. Her memory will be held dear by all who were fortunate enough to know her and be uplifted by her grace. She leaves behind a legacy of compassion, understanding, and an unshakable belief in the goodness of people. Susan's journey was a testament to a life well-lived, and her spirit will continue to guide and comfort those she has left behind.

In addition to today's Memorial Service, a second Memorial Service will be held at St. John's Lutheran Church, 587 Springfield Ave, Summit, NJ, on Sunday, January 12, at 2:00 p.m. with interment following the Service.
